School Bus Stop

Our first priority is the safety and well-being of our students. Due to the varied reasons our school bus routes may be delayed or in extreme situations, cancelled, it is not practical for drivers or staff to personally phone all those affected. Safety is everyone's responsibility and we must all be diligent when staying up to date on the status of our school bus routes.

All school bus route cancellations and delays in excess of 10 minutes will be posted on the "School Bus Stop"

If you have signed up for the alerts, upon posting the delay, you will receive an email or text with the route delay, length of delay and reason for the delay. You could also expect to see general alerts when weather conditions or an emergent situation arises regarding the bus route.

Attendance Reminders

<u>Lates</u>: Students must check in with Ms. Angus in the office to change an absence to a late, or an **automated call** will go out for an unexcused absence.

<u>Leaving Early</u>: Students must sign out at the office with **prior** parental permission. They cannot leave early without it.

<u>School Messenger App</u>: Please use the <u>School Messenger app</u> to report absences, late arrivals, or early pickups. It's the <u>official method</u> for all SD23 schools (K-12).

<u>Note</u>: Emails to teachers **do not** notify the office—parents must still use School Messenger.

Size of a Problem Strategy

At school, we use the "Size of the Problem" strategy to help students recognize how big or small a problem really is and to match their reactions appropriately.

For example, a small problem might be dropping a pencil, while a big problem could be someone getting seriously hurt. We encourage students to pause, think about the true size of the problem, and choose a reaction that fits.


Families can support this at home by talking with your child about the size of everyday problems and helping them practice calming strategies when their reactions feel bigger than the situation. This shared language between school and home helps children build resilience, problem-solving skills, and self-control.

Quick Tips for Home:

- When a problem happens, ask: "Is this a big problem or a small problem?"
- Praise your child when their reaction matches the size of the problem.
- Model calm problem-solving by talking through how you handle small problems.
- Practice with "what if" scenarios (e.g., "What if you spill some water?").





SKE HALLOWEEN GUIDELINES



On Friday, October 31st, students will participate in our annual Halloween Costume Parade at 2:00 p.m. This will occur on the back field, weather permitting. Families are welcome to attend. Please gather on the back field.

Dressing in a costume is optional. Your child may prefer to wear orange and black clothing, or their regular clothes. Students wishing to wear their costumes should get ready at home.

If your child chooses to wear a costume, please keep in mind that he/she will have to be comfortable for a day of learning at school and playing on the playground.

Please be sure that:

- your child will be able to wear their jacket over their costume for outside playtime.
- the costume is age- and school-appropriate (not gory or scary).
- hand-held accessories have been left at home (no weapons, brooms, wands, etc.)
- If the costume includes a mask, students may bring it to show the class but no face coverings are to be worn at school during the day.

To help prevent hurt feelings and disappointment, please have a discussion with your child about taking responsibility for their own costume and about respecting other children's costumes. Children should also take extra care while playing outside at lunch and recess.

After Halloween, please do not send Halloween candy/treats to school and do continue to send healthy fruits and vegetables.

What kind of apples do you like best? Have you even thought about it? Ms. Robertson's Kindergarten class held a taste-comparison this week!

Honeycrisp, Golden, Macintosh, Crabapple and Spartan: students tasted each in turn, and provided descriptive words to capture their thoughts. Was it crunchy? Sweet? Dry? Juicy? Why was the crabapple so yucky?

After tasting, students voted on which apples they liked, and which ones got the "thumbs down". Bet you can figure that out. Once the numbers were up, they identified which type got the most votes.

This seemingly simple task required critical and comparative thinking, involved vocabulary development, and stretched numeracy skills. And, bonus...delicious apples were enjoyed along the way (or not...looking at you, crabapple!)





What we are doing at SKE:




