ONLINE APPLICATION for STUDENT ENROLLMENT begins on Monday, February 3, 2025, at 7:00 am for 2025 - 2026 School Year

(for kindergarten, new students, and Programs of Choice for K - 12)

Schools will be open at 7:00 am to provide support to parents that require assistance.

Documentation Submission Deadline: Friday, March 14, 2025

HOW TO APPLY

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Please contact your school for assistance.

Online applications begin on Monday, February 3, 2025 at 7:00 am. Applications will be assigned a datetime stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school in person or by email by Friday, March 14, 2025.

- 1. Student's Birth Certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
 - a. Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
 - b. BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of supporting documentation below; or,
- Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of supporting documentation below.
- 3. Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address/Supporting Documentation
- Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
- Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
- · British Columbia registration of an automobile;
- British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
- A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.

AFTER Thursday, August 28, 2025

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2025, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2025. No exceptions.

Communication Emails

Please check school emails regularly to ensure that you stay updated on all important announcements and deadlines.

All school emails can also be found in the School Messenger app.

Student Messages

Please notify the office of important student messages (e.g. your child needs to go on bus or an appointment scheduled during the day). It is best to have this communicated to the office via phone or email since teachers cannot check their emails during instructional time.

All other messages can be communicated in student planners, such as after school arrangements different from the norm. Playdates should be made from home.

Please do not have student make last-minute playdate arrangements during the school day.

Safety Drills

We hold six fire drills per year: three each in the fall and spring. We also hold an earthquake drill and lockdown drill in the fall.

The earthquake drill provides students with a procedure to follow should they experience an earthquake anywhere anytime.

The purpose of the lockdown drill is to practice a safety procedure to be used in the event that students and staff are required to remain in a safe location until an all-clear signal is given.




Legining Stories What does learning look like at SKE?

Literacy Skills

Our kindergarten students recently participated in story workshops using loose parts. Students create imaginative stories using varied materials and items, and then narrate these stories. They are able to describe their choices, the characters, and what is happening in the world of the story they have created.

Our learning priority around supporting our student's physical and mental wellness is at work through socialemotional learning activities, as well as programs offered by our Counsellor and Inclusion teacher. Questions like "What does it mean to be healthy?" provoke rich dialogue, and the sharing of diverse ideas.

School Visit - Meaghan Hackinen






Diving Deep

Each SKE teacher has identified a numeracy practice, curiosity, or skill that they will be exploring in their classroom, with a focus on working towards developing students in relation to our numeracy priority.

What are South Kelowna's Student Learning Priorities?

To ensure learner confidence and success for each of our learners by:

- Focusing on number sense fluency, mathematical problem-solving and critical-thinking skills
- Promoting, nurturing and developing a growth mindset, stamina for learning and resiliency to challenge
- Approaching and supporting our learners through a holistic lens, recognizing the interconnectedness of physical and mental wellness



Using a visual prompt, teachers work together to solve a numeracy puzzle. Teamwork, communication, and collaboration are all needed, just like what we facilitate with our students.

<u>Updates on Parking & Parking Safety</u>

Thank you for taking care of our community by being mindful of, and following the parking lot expectations. Your modeling for our students makes a huge difference!

Thank you for:

- Using the paved pathways and crosswalks at all times rather than cutting through the parking lot and bus lane.
- Obeying ALL NO PARKING signs. Busses require clearance to enter and exit safely. This ensures the safety of all vehicles entering and exiting the school grounds.
- Keeping our neighbor's driveways open so they can access or exit their homes.

Drop Off & Pick Up:

<u>Spiers Road</u>: ** *BEST OPTION* ** If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. Please follow signage—do not park past the tall cedars as it makes it very difficult for busses to exit. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and <u>escort your child(ren)</u> across the road.

Bus Loop: *DROP OFF ONLY AFTER 8:10 a.m.* You may use the bus loop to drop off after the busses have left after 8:10 a.m. If dropping off in the bus loop, please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars. Do not leave your vehicle while utilizing the bus loop.

Staff Parking Lot: The parking lot is for STAFF only. Staff in various roles need to access the parking lot throughout the day, including those arriving for after-school activities.

SKE COLD WEATHER GUIDELINES

Snow Safety

Snow must stay on the ground (no throwing or kicking snow). This includes school property, at the bus stops & between home and school.

Sledding Rules

- Single riders only
- Riders must wear snow pants, boots & mitts
- Sleds are now provided by SKE. Thank you, PAC!
- Bottom down; knees ok as well.
- Facing forward (no tummy or back rides)
- Supervised at lunch only.


Students must be dressed properly for the weather. Students wait outside until the morning bell rings and they are expected to go outside for some fresh air at lunch and recess. Students must be dressed appropriately for the weather so that they remain safe and comfortable during these outside playtimes.

The following guidelines are in place at South Kelowna Elementary School.

BELOW FREEZING (-1 Celsius to -15)

Students will go outside. Parents should ensure that their child brings the following items needed to stay warm and comfortable when outside:

- Warm Coat
- Gloves Mittens
- Head/Ear covering
- Boots
- Waterproof snow pants



-20 Celsius: If the temperature reaches minus 20 Celsius, and the grounds are dry and the wind is calm, students will go outside for 15 minutes. After 15 minutes, the bell will ring to allow students to come inside to their classroom for the remainder of the outside play time.

TEMPERATURE REACHES -20 Celsius (with windy conditions)

If the temperature reaches -20 Celsius, and it is windy, students will stay inside their classrooms during lunch and recess.
