REMINDERS FROM THE OFFICE

LATES: Please see Ms. Hansen in the office to have your absence converted to a Late or parents will be phoned by the automated system for an unexcused absence.

LEAVING EARLY: Students must see Ms. Hansen in the office to leave the school any time before the end-of-day dismissal. Students will not be able to leave unless the office has prior parental permission.

If you haven't already downloaded the School Messenger App for your cell phone, you should give it a try! It's the most efficient way to let the school know about your child's absence, late or early appointment. It is used by all School District #23 schools for students from K-12!

STUDENT MESSAGES

Messages should **only** be for emergency situations (e.g. car problems on your way, or an appointment scheduled during the day). Otherwise please use the student planners for Gr. 1-6 to communicate any messages regarding after school arrangements different from the norm (kindergarten students send a note to teacher).

Playdates should be made from home.

Please be considerate of the many phone calls we receive through our office on a daily basis and try to keep your calls to very important messages only. Thank you.







VOLUNTEERING

A reminder if you are volunteering to please ensure you have completed a Criminal Record Check (CRC) form at the school office prior to volunteering (no charge). These forms must be completed every four years.

Please contact Robyn in the office if you are unsure if you have an approved CRC on file.

We are very fortunate to have many options for dropping off students at SKE. By taking a few extra minutes in the morning and noting the following safety rules, we can ensure safer access for students.

<u>Kindergarten & Grade 4-6 parents</u>: please park to drop off/ pick up in the <u>back field</u>.

<u>Grades 1-3 parents</u>: please park to drop off and pick up on <u>Spiers Rd (west/east)</u>.

The Staff Parking Lot is for STAFF ONLY. Please do not park in the staff parking lot during the day.

If you are dropping off your child and the bus has already left, you may drive through the bus lane to drop off. **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE** in the bus lane at any time of the school day.

Please be sure your child will be **able to wear their jacket** over their costume for outside playtime.

Please be sure that the costume is age-appropriate and school-appropriate (not gory or scary).

Please leave hand-held accessories at home (no weapons, brooms, wands, etc.)

If the costume includes a **mask**, students may bring it to show the class but it will not be possible for him/her to wear it.

To help prevent hurt feelings and disappointment, please have a discussion with your child about taking responsibility for their own costume and about respecting other children's costumes. Children should also take extra care while playing outside at lunch and recess.

After Halloween, please do not send Halloween candy/treats to school and do continue to send healthy fruits and vegetables.


