## IMPORTANT SAFETY REMINDERS



Here at SKE, we have options for dropping off students in the morning and picking up in the afternoon. However, with vehicles coming and going from so many directions, this can increase safety concerns. Please take a few extra minutes in the morning and note the following safety rules, so we can ensure safer assess for students.

<u>BUS LOOP:</u> <u>If dropping off in the bus loop (after 8:15 only), please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk.</u> This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars. Do not use the bus loop when busses are present.

<u>SPIERS ROAD:</u> If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and escort your child(ren) across the road.

<u>PARKING LOT:</u> The Staff Parking lot is for <u>STAFF ONLY.</u> Please do not park in the staff parking lot during the day or after school. We have staff that must be able to access the parking lot at that time.

#### A few things that continue to be a concern:

- Parents/Caregivers ignoring the "no parking" signs along the road, restricting vision for cars exiting the parking lot.
- Cars blocking the handicapped parking and sidewalk accesses.
- Parents using the restricted bus turn-around as a parking area, passing, blocking and congesting the exit.
- Parents blocking and parking in neighboring driveways. Please be aware that our neighbors need to access their properties with ease.




TICK SEASON is upon us and there have been ticks spotted throughout the region.

# PREPARED FOR WARMER WEATHER?

As we look forward to warmer weather and sunny days, we want to remind all families to ensure students are coming to school prepared.

#### **Class Placement Request Reminder**

Submissions accepted: April 2 - May 12, 2025

Staff will be meeting before the end of this school year to discuss the placement of students in classes for next year. There are often many changes before classes are finalized in September. Placement of all students is done after careful consideration and a great deal of time and thought. Please be assured that teachers care about each individual child and there are many factors to consider for the best placement for each child. To achieve a good balance in each class, we consider many factors, including the following:

☐ Age	Peer relations
☐ Gender	Previous placement histo
<ul><li>Academic achievement</li></ul>	Special education needs
Class size and composition	Learning styles

With respect to combined/split classes, please remember that combined classes are a fact of school life, and are more the norm than the exception. We are very confident that the students in all classes receive a full and rich academic program at their grade level.

Parents may submit a written request regarding placement (not for a specific teacher), which focuses on the kind of learning environment in which you believe your child learns best, to the school principal for when we begin to tentatively place students in their next year's classes. To ensure your requests are received, letters must be presented in hard copy and addressed to the Principal before May 12. Letters that focus on learning are welcome and can at times be very helpful. In the past, there have been parent requests based solely on friends. This is not the purpose of these requests. Your child's teacher and our extended team know your child well and will have good ideas about who they learn well with. The requests support us as there can be special circumstances such as special needs or history that we may not be aware of or that you feel we may need to be reminded of. Please give writing a letter serious consideration based on the above. Although we strive to accommodate parents' wishes for placement, we may not place your child in the classroom you have requested. The final authority rests with the school. Thank you in advance for your understanding of our placement protocol.

#### Deadline for submissions is May 12, 2024.

NOTE: These are for "Exceptional Requests" only, if your child has a specific need that you do not think we are aware of. We will not be accepting specific teacher requests as some teachers may be changing grades, taking leaves and/or moving schools.




