REPORTING ABSENCES/LATES

EMAILS TO TEACHERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

If your child has an unexcused absence, you will receive a phone call notification.

Safety & Security Please review the following SKE safety expectations as a family:

- We are a closed campus. Students are not allowed to access the nearby store after parent drop-off or before parent pick-up. All SD23 elementary schools are "closed campus".
- 2. Parents, caregivers and visitors must go straight to the office upon arrival to SKE. Do not go directly to any student classrooms. Office staff will assist you as needed.
- 3. Please make advance arrangements with your child's teacher if you need to meet with them.
- 4. Volunteering? Thank you! All volunteers are to wear a lanyard and badge which you will get at the office.

- ★ Absences: please remember to notify the office in regards to any absences or lateness, even if you have let the teacher know. Please use School Messenger. See more information at www.sd23.bc.ca/schoolmessenger/P ages/default.aspx#/=
- ★ If your child is late, they must check in at the office upon arrival before going to their classroom, otherwise they remain marked as absent. If you sign out your child early with the help of School Messenger, you must still come to the office upon your arrival to pick them up.
- ★ Medical Alert: If your child has a medical alert, please make sure to contact the office to obtain and fill out a Medical Alert Planning Form

VERIFICATION FORMS

Please watch for verification forms coming home this month. These forms are very important for the office to have so your contact information is accurate when needed.

Please sign & return them even if nothing has changed. They are DUE on September 30th.

VOLUNTEER & CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS

If you are planning to participate in activities in your child's classroom or help with field trips, a School District #23 Criminal Record Check must be completed. **This is mandatory for all volunteers, and is paid for by the district.** We strongly recommend you complete one right away, as the process can take a few weeks before it is finalized. We cannot permit volunteers in the school or on field trips until the finalized record check is received.

Note that this process must be renewed every four years. In order to drive other children to field trips or sporting events, you must complete the "Driver Declaration" form as well, and bring in your vehicle insurance and driver's license to be photocopied.

STUDENT FEES

Our online payment system for student supplies and cultural fees should be up and running soon. At that time, please go to our school website, and select the link to register & pay for fees online, or visit the following website to register:

www.centralokanagan.schoolcashonline.com

Register by selecting "Get Started Now" and follow the steps. After you receive the confirmation email, please select the 'click here' option, sign in and add each of your children to your household account.

We ask that you register as soon as possible. Along with the option to electronically pay from your bank account, there is also the option to pay by credit card. Student fees are \$50 per child (\$40 supplies + \$10 cultural).

If there is a financial barrier in place for your family, please reach out to Ms. Lemon (call or email).

School Fees are due SEPTEMBER 30TH.

SKE Food Program

SKE's food access programs will be starting Monday, Sept 15th.

It is a value of our school district to ensure food security for our families, and we want to ensure supports are in place if your family needs them.

Brown Bag Lunch Program: participating students will receive a lunch each day. We will have students pick up their lunch in the morning (between 8:15 and 8:25 am) from the school kitchen. We invite students to bring their own lunch kit so they can transfer the items into it if they choose.

Breakfast Program: participating students can select from a variety of healthy breakfast options, including toasted bagels, English muffins, yogourt, oatmeal, etc...They can enjoy their breakfast before school, picking it up in the school kitchen.

Food for Thought Grocery Program: participating families will receive a grocery bag of food items each week that can be used to prepare healthy food at home. This bag will have both perishable and non-perishable items in it.

Please contact Ms. Lemon to let us know if your child/children/family would benefit from any of these programs. Students can join or leave the program anytime throughout the year - simply be in touch with Ms. Lemon or Ms. Angus to keep us updated. Participation is free.







READING


All students will demonstrate improvement in their reading, and demonstrate growth in the critical thinking tools and strategies connected to appreciating and understanding text.

New 2025/2026 Classes

We were so excited to transition to this year's classes this week. We also know this can be an emotional experience for students. Encouraging nervous students to connect with their new teacher and peers, and to participate in opening activities can go a long way towards building confidence. Playing with old and new friends at lunch and recess is also a key way to settle into new routines.

H's also important to note that most of our classes are combined grades. This is typical for a small school. All classes, whether one or two grades, are made up of a broad range of skills and abilities, and are intentionally designed to be diverse and varied. Teachers meet students where they are at, working towards each student's individual goals.

Important District #23 Information

The Central Okanagan School District's Appeals Process

Board Policy 460 – Appeals states that, "A student or a parent of a student who is entitled to an educational program in the Central Okanagan Public Schools may appeal a decision of an employee of the Board of Education which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student". For a complete description of the Appeals Policy, along with the recommended steps to follow in attempting to solve a problem, please refer to Policy 460 – Appeals, that can be accessed from the 'Board Policies' link under the Board of Education heading on the School District homepage (www.sd23.bc.ca).

The Central Okanagan School District's Financial Hardship Clause

Within Board Regulation 425R – Student Fees (Regulations) (see www.sd23.bc.ca), the Board of Education has indicated "that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship". Clause 8.5 in the Regulations states: "Principals are directed to establish a procedure in each school which will allow for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families. Such procedures will preserve the dignity of families who may be unable to pay". Please contact the school Principal if you are facing a financial hardship that may restrict the ability of your child to access a school program.

The Central Okanagan School District's Sanctuary Schools Policy

Board Policy 421 – Sanctuary Schools (see www.sd23.bc.ca) upholds the Board's commitment to providing educational opportunities for all students who are ordinarily resident in the Central Okanagan, including those with precarious immigration status or no immigration status.

Student registrations that pertain to Policy 421 – Sanctuary Schools will be processed through the Welcome Centre.


Our goal!

ORANGE SHIRT DAY SEPTEMBER 29TH



Orange Shirt Day is observed every year on September 30th to acknowledge the lasting harm caused by the residential school system to Indigenous children's sense of self-worth and well-being. It is also a time to reaffirm our shared commitment to making sure that every child matters.

The day grew from a 2013 commemoration event at the former St. Joseph Mission Residential School in Williams Lake, B.C., and is inspired by the story of Phyllis (Jack) Webstad, who had her new orange shirt taken away on her first day at residential school. Her story has become a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom, and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

Why September 30th?

This date was chosen because it marks the time of year when children were historically taken from their homes to attend residential schools. It also aligns with the beginning of the school year, offering a timely opportunity to promote anti-racism and anti-bullying efforts within schools and communities.

Orange Shirt Day is a time for:

- Reflection on the history and legacy of residential schools
- Listening to and honouring the voices of survivors
- Fostering conversations about reconciliation
- Coming together in hope for future generation





