


Principal's Message

STUDENT PLACEMENT REQUESTS for SEPTEMBER 2025

Submissions accepted: April 2 - May 12, 2025

Staff will be meeting before the end of this school year to discuss the placement of students in classes for next year. There are often many changes before classes are finalized in September. Placement of all students is done after careful consideration and a great deal of time and thought. Please be assured that teachers care about each individual child and there are many factors to consider for the best placement for each child. To achieve a good balance in each class, we consider many factors, including the following:

□ Age	
□ Gender	Peer relations
☐ Academic achievement	Previous placement history
☐ Class size and composition	Special education needs
	Learning styles

With respect to combined/split classes, please remember that combined classes are a fact of school life, and are more the norm than the exception. We are very confident that the students in all classes receive a full and rich academic program at their grade level.

Parents may submit a written request regarding placement (not for a specific teacher), which focuses on the kind of learning environment in which you believe your child learns best, to the school principal for when we begin to tentatively place students in their next year's classes. **To ensure your requests are received, letters must be presented in hard copy and addressed to the Principal before May 12.** Letters that focus on learning are welcome and can at times be very helpful. In the past, there have been parent requests based solely on friends. This is not the purpose of these requests. Your child's teacher and our extended team know your child well and will have good ideas about who they learn well with. The requests support us as there can be special circumstances such as special needs or history that we may not be aware of or that you feel we may need to be reminded of. Please give writing a letter serious consideration based on the above. Although we strive to accommodate parents' wishes for placement, we may not place your child in the classroom you have requested. The final authority rests with the school. Thank you in advance for your understanding of our placement protocol.

<u>Deadline for submissions is May 12, 2024.</u>

NOTE: These are for "Exceptional Requests" only, if your child has a specific need that you do not think we are aware of. We will not be accepting specific teacher requests as some teachers may be changing grades, taking leaves and/or moving schools.





VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TRACK & FIELD



The intermediate students from South Kelowna Elementary School will be participating in Track and Field events 2 days per week at school starting Wednesday, April 23rd until Wednesday, May 21.

In order to run stations on each of these days, we will need parent volunteers to run a station along with the 4 intermediate teachers.

The days we will need commitment from our volunteers are **Wednesday** and **Friday afternoons.** On each of these days, we will need our volunteers at the school for 12:00 pm. We will be starting the 20 minute station rotations at 12:10 ending at 1:30 pm.

Our Apple Bowl date is on Tues. April 22 this year which happens to be the day before we start our school program. We will introduce the grade 4's to the basics, before Apple Bowl day, so they understand how each station works. Apple Bowl is a fun day, so any data collected will not be used towards determining who qualifies for the District Track Meet.

Please note that all volunteers must have their criminal record check and volunteer forms filled out and up to date at the office prior to volunteering.

SAFETY REMINDERS

<u>Home Safety - Walking Home</u>

- Do a visual check as you are walking. Look out for strange people and strange vehicles.
- · When possible, walk with others.
- Don't get into a car with a stranger. Tell the stranger your parents are expecting you on this route and will be by soon to pick you up.
- Don't take anything from a stranger and do not approach the stranger's vehicle.
- · Be polite but be firm. If the stranger continues to bother you, go to a neighbour's home. If neighbours are too far away, discuss with your parents an alternate plan. Develop a password to use when your parents ser omeone to pick you up.

Bikes, Skateboards, Scooters, Rollerblades

Please note that bicycles, scooters, skateboards and rollerblades may not be used on school property. Bicycles and scooters must be walked on school property and stored for the day. Helmets are mandatory. Please use a lock to secure bikes to the bike rack upon arrival at school. Scooters must be folded and stored in the classroom. Skateboards are to be carried on school property and stored away for the day.



Bikes are ridden with the flow of traffic. Helmets and arm signals must be used for safety. Bikes are walked in the crosswalk and on school property. Bike racks are out of bounds during school hours.

· Bus Safety



Skateboards are not allowed on the school bus. Skateboards become potential projectiles if the bus driver ever has to perform an evasive maneuver. Small items may be carried onto the bus (including a musical instrument) if they will fit under the seat or on your lap. If the driver thinks an item will block the aisle, floor space, or seat, it will not be allowed on the bus.





SCHOOL SECURITY



Safety is very important here at South Kelowna Elementary. As such, we would like to remind our parents of a number of security precautions in place:

- > All outside doors remain locked during the day, except the front entrance door, which is visible to the office. Anyone who enters the school is expected to report to the office and notify the secretary or principal of their purpose.
- > Volunteers are welcome to support students. Please make prior arrangements with classroom teachers and remember to sign in at the office.
- > Instructional time is important for learning, therefore, we ask visitors to refrain from loitering in school hallways.
- > All visitors are asked to report to the office, sign in and out, and wear a visitor's badge while in the school.
- Morning playground supervision is from 8:10 8:30 am and after school from 2:30 2:45 pm. There is no supervision after 2:45 pm. Students must report home after 2:45 pm or have a parent with them to play after 2:45 pm.
- > Please pre-arrange playdates in advance. Our school phone is meant for calling home, not to set-up after school playdates.
- > Students waiting for parent pick-up during the day will wait inside the school. Parents need to pick up students from the office.
- > Safety procedures (fire drill, earthquake drill, lock-down drill) are practiced regularly.
- \triangleright Parents are asked **NOT** to use our student washrooms please ask at the office to use our staff adult washrooms.


