School Community Learning Priority

As a school team, we are all working towards the following numeracy goal for our learners:


To ensure learner confidence and success for each of our learners by focusing on number sense fluency, mathematical problem-solving, and critical thinking skills.

Each teacher has joined a collaborative learning group to explore an area of numeracy instruction that they would like to develop in their teaching practice. Throughout this year, teachers will engage in learning opportunities together, and then embed their learning in their classroom instruction and lessons.

Supporting at Home

Numeracy instruction has changed and shifted over the years. What your children are bringing home or talking about may look different than what parents and caregivers remember from Math class.

If you are wondering how numeracy instruction flows from one concept to the next, check out the videos from numeracy educator Graham Fletcher. These videos visually demonstrate the intentional design of "steps" in math instruction.



Outdoor Expectations

Unless the weather is extreme, students are expected to wait outside until the morning bell rings and they are expected to go outside for some fresh air at break time. Please ensure your children are dressed for the weather! The snow will arrive soon.

We have been discussing the following winter playground expectations with our students. Please review

- Throwing or kicking snow is not acceptable as it may cause injury to another student.
- Sliding is allowed on the South back field only during the school day.
- Students should be wearing snow pants to slide. Wood or metal sliders are not allowed. Soft, plastic or vinyl sliders only!
- Students should wait until the sliders in front of them are out of the way before sliding.
- Students should walk up the hill away from the sliding area.
- Only those students with sliders should be in the sliding area.
- Only one person per slider is allowed. No pairs or groups together.
- Students must slide on their knees or bottom and face forward.
- No standing or sliding on stomach.



Supervision is provided after 8:10 am in the morning and until 2:45 pm in the afternoon.

Students should not be on the playground outside those times without a parent.

Safety Reminders: Drop Off & Parking



Please take a few extra minutes in the morning and note the following safety rules, so we ensure safer access for students.

BUS LOOP: If dropping off in the bus loop, please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars. **Do not use the bus loop** between 8:00 am and 8:20 am.

<u>SPIERS ROAD:</u> If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and escort your child(ren) across the road.

PARKING LOT: The staff parking lost is for **STAFF ONLY**. Please do not park in the staff parking lot during the day or after school. We have staff that must be able to access the parking lot at that time.

A FEW THINGS THAT CONTINUE TO BE A CONCERN:

- Parking Lot Use: We have observed parents stopping in the middle of the parking lot instead of using the bus loop or surrounding parking areas, as well as cars passing each other in the parking lot.
- Parents/Caregivers ignoring the "no parking" signs along the road, restricting vision for cars exiting from the school.
- Cars blocking the handicapped parking and sidewalk access.
- Parents using the restricted bus turn-around as a parking area, passing, blocking and congesting the exit.
- Parent blocking and parking in neighboring driveways.
