WS SAFETY DRILLS

We hold six fire drills per year: three each, in the fall and spring. We also hold an earthquake drill and a lockdown drill in the fall.

The earthquake drill provides students with a procedure to follow should they experience an earthquake anywhere anytime.

The purpose of the lockdown drill is to practice a safety procedure to be used in the event that students and staff are required to remain in a safe location until an all-clear signal is given.

Parents and visitors at the school during these drills will be also accounted for.

LEAVING EARLY: Students must see Ms. Angus in the office to leave the school any time before the end-of-day dismissal. Students will not be able to leave unless the office has prior parental permission.

STUDENT MESSENGERf: you haven't already downloaded the School Messenger app for your cell phone, you should give it a try! It's the most efficient way to let the school know about your child's absence, late arrival or early appointment. It is used by all School District 23 schools for students from K-12! Emails to teachers will NOT notify the office and so parents are still required to use School Messenger.

On Thursday, October 31st, students will participate in our annual Halloween Costume Parade at 2:00 p.m. This will occur on the back field, weather permitting. Families are welcome to attend.

SKE Halloween Guidelines:

Dressing in a costume is optional. Your child may prefer to wear orange and black clothing, or their regular clothes. Students wishing to wear their costumes should get ready at home.

If your child chooses to wear a costume, please keep in mind that he/she will have to be comfortable for a day of learning at school and playing on the playground.

Please be sure that:

- your child will be able to wear their jacket over their costume for outside playtime.
- the costume is age-appropriate and school -appropriate (not gory or scary).
- hand-held accessories have been left at home (no weapons, brooms, wands, etc.)
- If the costume includes a mask, students may bring it to show the class but no face coverings are to be worn at school during the day.

To help prevent hurt feelings and disappointment, please have a discussion with your child about taking responsibility for their own costume and about respecting other children's costumes. Children should also take extra care while playing outside at lunch and recess.

After Halloween, please do not send Halloween candy/treats to school and do continue to send healthy fruits and vegetables.






SKE PAC Updates


