- 1. **Principal's Report** Jasmine Lemon
- Thank you for parents that helped out with hot chocolate
- Would like feedback about Harmony Day, for sign-up, food, ways to make it better for parents
- School district has worked with COPAC to figure out insurance requirements

2. President's report - Kay Bowering

2.1 Thank you's

We received a number of thank you's from the COBSS Program – Central Okanagan Bursary and Scholarship Society. We funded 2 students for approximately 350\$ each, these are for former SKE students.

- Things from our budget that we paid for since lat meeting:
 Field trip commitments \$10000 from \$10000 budget
 Scream Program \$1300 from \$1500 budget (this is a program to help grade 6 students transition to middle school)
- School supplies (agendas) \$1648.76 of \$2000 budget
- PAC Welcome BBQ profit: \$703.46.
- Gaming grant came in at \$5340 and is now in the gaming account.
 Current Balance of gaming grant is \$9276.98. A large part of this grant money will be used for volleyball nets.

- White Hat Project -digital literacy and internet safety. It is live but remote. Live but remote is \$450. This is designed for grades 4 and 5. Jasmine says that in our context it would be great to include the grade 6s.
- There are a few questions still to be answered about numbers. Jasmine will look into whether this fits into the allocated budget.
- Jasmine fully supports this program.

10. **KLO representative**: vacant position, nothing to report

OLD BUSINESS | NEW BUSINESS

- Jasmine brings up: tentative family bingo in November. Jordana states that she needs more time to plan. Jasmine will remove this from the calendar.
- Ashley: asks about school skiing trips Jasmine says that grade 5 and 6 classes do cross country ski events.
- New discussion arises: safety. Jasmine says that the kitchen stove/ovens are
 gas, but she would prefer electric stove/ovens for safety reasons. The city will
 partially pay for electric stoves. Jasmine is pushing hard to get the school board
 to approve funding for electric stove/oven. Jasmine will come back with more
 info. Perhaps this is something PAC could fund.
- Jasmine talks about some of the safety drills and how the school does them, in
 particular hold and secure drills. Ashley asks if PAC can support with anything.
 Jasmine informs us that there will be a safety audit this Friday and if something
 comes up that could be helpful she will let us know.
